
## The Great Boat Toolbox Challenge - 2019



**POST SCRIPT TO THE PHOTOS FROM  
THE GREAT TOOLBOX CHALLENGE 2019  
FROM P/C W. BROOKS RILEY, AP**



As a post script to the photos sent by Cdr. J. Street Broadbent, AP. Many years ago, I was asked by our then Commander to put together a “participatory” program for a squadron meeting.

The Education Department was planning some electives (engine maintenance, electronics, etc.) so I put together a “tool box scavenger hunt” theme. All were asked to bring the basic tool box kept on their boat. A list of about 100 items was gathered as a “suggested” should have in the box. Points were given for each tool on the list, and if the tools were damaged, points were subtracted. The idea was to be sure that all your tools were in good working condition. I think the first time we did this, there were 4 participants. P/C Read Van Zile, AP brought a Fisher-Price “playschool kit”. Everready flashlights were given as awards.

This, 2019, was the third time we did this, and each time we have more participants. We also sold the USPS self paced learning guide HAND TOOLS as an idea of HOW TO use tools.

There were also some “trivia questions” about tools found on a boat...What is a FID??? What is a KERF? When making a saw cut, where is the cut made??

Points were given for the most unusual tool oldest tool, and the dumbest tool (most useless).

It’s a good way for members to get involved at a meeting.

G'day', sailors! In lieu of the mysteries of record-keeping, I researched recent boating safety and Homeland Security issues in the Mid-Atlantic, and found this:

**Try On Your Lifejacket!** Last boating season, the Coast Guard received an increased number of reports of incidents from recreational boaters where infant lifejackets did not perform as expected in the water. These incidents involved multiple models and manufacturers. Investigations were completed, and there were no findings of non-conformance or manufacturing defects. It was confirmed that the products met Coast Guard requirements and the applicable industry standards. The findings of these investigations did highlight the importance of checking the fit and performance of lifejackets on users, especially on infants and children, while floating in water.. All Coast Guard approved lifejackets meet industry standards and Coast Guard requirements for construction, performance, and manufacturing; however, the Coast Guard recommends everyone try on their lifejacket in a controlled water environment to ensure proper fit and performance on their body.

**Wear Your Life Jacket to Work Day:** On May 17, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) reminded everyone of the importance of boater safety by celebrating *Wear Your Life Jacket to Work Day*. I participated, much to the amusement of my coworkers, and consternation of my supervisors, who think I'm three sheets to the wind a lot anyway.

**Boat Speed Map:** If you are exploring new anchorages and poking about the many rivers on the Bay this season, be mindful of the speed zones that have been established. Fortunately, you can see an on-line map on the DNR website at:

**S/V Certainty:** Progress being made on all fronts despite the numerous rainy days, hopefully she'll be in the water by the Maryland Yacht Club cruise, which we hope to attend by water if the weather gods cooperate. I was able to get the anti-fouling bottom paint done finally, except for a few square inches around the keel which you can't see unless we find ourselves testing the water depth with our mast. The new bilge pump is going in, the new motor un-winterized and ready to go, checking the mast support post and deck, and washing and waxing our baby this week, then stepping the mast and dunking her on Memorial Day weekend. The new cabin floor (waterproof vinyl over the old plywood) should be in by June, and hopefully we will even have had time to clean the outer strip of the monstrous 170% genoa, which is looking a bit grimy at the edges.

We plan on being out on the water more this year – that little distraction called our “wedding” really clogged up last year, in addition to the 70+ inches of rain – so we hope to see you at some cruises!




